



The Coachella Valley Public Cemetery is working with the Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District to decrease mosquito breeding on the grounds of the cemetery. Our mission is providing an attractive, safe and serene environment for our community. As of June 1, 2019, for your benefit, we are no longer placing flower cups/cans in the markers that have been recently installed or set.

Why this change is important

- Mosquitos can carry viruses that make you sick or even die.
- In the right setting, a mosquito can go from an egg to an adult in five to seven days.
- Mosquitoes need water to breed. They can lay hundreds of eggs in containers with water as small as a table spoon.
- The best way to reduce mosquito breeding is to remove any standing water.
- By removing standing water not only do we reduce the pest, but also the chance of getting sick.

Please help us by not placing flowers for loved ones in a container that has or can collect standing water.
