Additional Parking Available for Mother's Day Weekend

The cemetery has added an additional parking lot

Coachella, CA: The Coachella Valley Public Cemetery District (District) is preparing to welcome guests for the 2022 Mother's Day weekend. The cemetery will have restrooms, additional trash disposal stations and other features to ensure guests have needed facilities while visiting during the busy weekend.

"Mother's Day is one of our busiest days of the year," says General Manager Joshua Bonner. "We are taking steps to ensure everyone has a comfortable visit, which includes additional parking." The District has added an additional parking lot located on the west side of the cemetery. The overflow parking will help relieve expected traffic in the heavily visited lots 22-24 and 28-30. The public is reminded not to double park as it creates an access issue for emergency vehicles needing to access the grounds.

About the CVPCD

The Coachella Valley Public Cemetery District was formed August 8, 1927, as an independent special district, serving the public cemetery needs of the residents of Riverside County; our boundaries include the unincorporated areas of Mecca, Oasis, Bermuda Dunes, Thermal, Vista Santa Rosa, North Shore, Chiriaco Summit, Indio Hills, Desert Center and the cities of Coachella, Indio, La Quinta, Indian Wells, Palm Desert, and parts of Rancho Mirage, and is over 700 square miles larger than all other cemetery districts combined in Riverside County. The district has performed over 21,000 interments/burials and has set over 14,000 headstones/grave markers. The total district property consists of sixty acres, twenty-nine of the sixty have been developed for interment purposes.
